## **"SHIP AND WIN" BACK AGAIN!**



#### Del Mar's highly

successful program to lure out-of-state horses will return this season with an additional boost to the incentives.

The "Ship and Win" program helped attract 137 horses from other racing

jurisdictions during the track's 2012 meet, helping increase field size and causing a positive ripple effect for other California race meets.

Last year the track guaranteed all horses that raced at the meet who had started outside California in their previous outing a check for \$1,000, plus a further bonus of 25% added to whatever purse monies they won in that first local start. This year's enhanced version of the program still will offer the \$1,000 checks to horses who qualify, but additionally will up the purse bonus to 33.3%!

Once again the \$1,000 payment will apply to any starter in any race at Del Mar, including its full list of 43 advertised and overnight stakes. The 33.3% purse bonus, however, counts only toward general overnight purses, meaning all stakes races are excluded.

The 33.3% bonus can add sizeable funds to an initial start at Del Mar for an owner. In the case of a \$75,000 maiden special weight purse, the winner's share amounts to \$45,000. Adding in the bonus payment means an additional check for \$15,000. The track's lowest-level claiming race – for \$8,000 – carries a purse of \$20,000 and a winner's prize of \$12,000. The bonus for that horse would be \$4,000.

Those bonus figures would be enhanced further still by the automatic \$1,000 payment each out-of-state runner earns in their initial start at Del Mar.

"We are pleased to partner with Del Mar for the third year in a row. The "Ship and Win" program is a proven winner," said TOC Board Chair Mike Pegram. "The number of owners and trainers that participate has increased each year and we have no reason to believe that won't be the case once again in 2013." "We are happy that TOC supports and understands the value of the program not only for Del Mar but the other race meets in the state," said Del Mar's Racing Secretary Tom Robbins. "Participants ran at all levels in 2012 with over 40% earning a purse bonus in addition to the \$1,000 for starting, and the vast majority of horses that participated made additional starts in California."

## **Broader Distribution Aids Increases in ADW**

The 2012-2013 meet marked the first time Santa Anita's races were broadcast by both HRTV and TVG. The additional distribution helped the meet see increased ADW handle on live races of 34% and nearly \$1.2Million of additional purse revenue. Over the same period, Golden Gate Fields saw handle increases of 55% on live races and \$242,000 in purse money. These gains helped Santa Anita and Golden Gate realize increases in total revenue-producing handle of 3.03% and 2.79% respectively.




