

"Ship and Win" Back Again!

Del Mar's highly successful program to attract out-of-state horses will return for a fourth straight season.

The Ship and Win program helped attract 149 horses from other racing jurisdictions during the track's 2013 meet, helping increase field size and causing a positive ripple effect for other California race meets.

The 2013 program once again proved successful. The track and TOC guaranteed all horses that raced at the meet who had started outside California in their previous outing a check for \$1,000 plus a further bonus of 33.3% added to whatever purse monies they won in that first local start. This year's program will carry the same incentives.

Once again the \$1,000 payment will apply to any starter in any race at Del Mar, including its full list of 43 advertised and overnight stakes. The 33.3% purse bonus, however, counts only toward general overnight purses, meaning all stakes races are excluded.

"TOC is excited to partner with Del Mar for the fourth year in a row. The Ship and Win program has been successful not only for Del Mar but those race meets that follow," said TOC President Joe Morris. "The number of participants has increased each year, and we look forward to keeping those numbers moving in a positive direction in 2014."

"We are happy that TOC supports and understands the value of the program not only for Del Mar but the other race meets in the state," said Tom Robbins, Del Mar's Vice President of Racing. "Participants ran at all levels in 2013 with over 40% earning a purse bonus in addition to the \$1,000 for starting, and the vast majority of horses that participated made additional starts in California."

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Early this year, TOC successfully supported efforts to pass Senate Bill 777 (Hernandez), which allows the tracks and fairs to continue to deduct a percentage of exotic pari-mutuel pools to defray the cost of workers' compensation insurance. This deduction is a vital part of keeping the cost of racing in California affordable.

On the Internet Poker front, Sen. Lou Correa introduced SB 1366, which is sponsored by the San Manuel Band of Mission Indians. TOC is working closely with the Tribe and the senator as well as our industry partners to make sure horseracing is included in the bill once it is heard.

AB 229, an Internet Poker bill introduced by Assemblyman Reggie Jones-Sawyer, excludes racing; and TOC and our racing partners have made it very clear that we will strongly oppose such a bill. We will continue to work with Jones-Sawyer as the Assembly holds its first hearing on the measures later this month. On the plus side, Tribal governments are now publically acknowledging that any bill must include racing in order to pass. We have been very clear that we want parity in the legislation – not a mitigation fund.




